Spoken sentences and narrative

Using modelling (EYFS)

Activities and strategies to try:

- Children learn language best through playing and having fun. Get down to the child's level so that they can see you and hear you.
- Use these modelling techniques in ANY situation as way of developing children's spoken words and sentences.
- Comment on what they are doing or playing with e.g. "bed time", "baby sleeping". This helps to give them the words for their actions. Try to use comments instead of questions.
- Interpret what the child is doing or requesting by modelling the language they
 could use e.g. if the child points to their drink, model "drink" or "juice" to label
 what they have asked for.
- Wait for the child to respond. It is important to give them space and time to talk.
 This may take some time.
- Repeat any spoken words or sentences that the child uses,. This helps them to know that you have understood them and hear good examples of simple language.
- Expand the child's spoken utterances by adding 1 or 2 more words to what they
 have said e.g. if the child says "there's a car", you could say "yes, there's a big
 car".

Everyday Strategies Checklist:

Did you:

- ⇒ Follow what the child wanted to do?
- ⇒ Wait for them to talk?
- ⇒ Listen to what they said?
- ⇒ Talk about what they were doing?
- ⇒ Use short and simple sentences?



Measuring Progress:

Increase in the child's understanding and use of simple vocabulary when communicating and playing.
