Activities and strategies to try



walking, washing hands.

Tell the child what he/she is doing when he/she is doing it, eg jumping,

- Demonstrate a range of activities with pretend play toys eg teddy walk, sleep,
 jump etc. Give teddy/doll to the child and ask him/her to copy the actions.
- When you are looking at books together, emphasise the action words and see if he/she can find out who's sleeping/running.
- Play 'Follow my Leader' with simple instructions for the child to follow.
 Emphasise the action words.
- Play 'Simon Says' eg 'Simon says jump.' See if the child can carry out the action.
- Sing action songs, eg 'lf you're happy and you know it (clap your hands, stamp your feet'), 'Hokey Cokey' etc. Encourage the child to join in with the actions.
- Play with musical instruments show the child how to shake, bang, rattle the instruments.
- When cooking, take turns to stir, cut, pour the ingredients talk about what you are doing.

Measuring progress: Ability to understand a wider range of verbs when given spoken directions - ability to use a wider range of verbs in spoken language, when describing an event or a story.
